We are the controller of personal data obtained via our website, meaning we are the organisation legally responsible for deciding how and for what purposes it is used. COGENT CONNECTIVE LIMITED is a limited company registered in Scotland with company number SC774434 and registered office address at Unit 5 Gateway Business Park, Beancross Road, Grangemouth, Scotland, FK3 8WX.

We take your privacy very seriously. Please read this privacy policy carefully as it contains important information on who we are and how and why we collect, store, use and share any information relating to you (your **personal data**) in connection with your use of our website. It also explains your rights in relation to your personal data and how to contact us or a relevant regulator in the event you have a complaint.

We collect, use and are responsible for certain personal data about you. When we do so we are subject to the UK General Data Protection Regulation (**UK GDPR**).

Given the nature of our website, we do not expect to collect the personal data of anyone under 13 years old. If you are aware that any personal data of anyone under 13 years old has been shared with our website please let us know so that we can delete that data.

This privacy policy is primarily written for adults, including parents and guardians of child users.

What this policy applies to

This privacy policy relates to your use of our website only.

Throughout our website we may link to other websites owned and operated by certain trusted third parties to make additional information available to you). Those third party websites may also gather information about you in accordance with their own separate privacy policies. For privacy information relating to those third party websites, please consult their privacy policies as appropriate.

Personal data we collect about you

The personal data we collect about you depends on the particular activities carried out through our website. We will collect and use the following personal data about you:

- your name, address and contact information, including email address and telephone number and company details
- any delivery addresses specified for your order
- your gender
- location data
- your account details, such as username and login details
- your billing information, transaction and payment card or other payment method information
- bank account and payment details
- details of any information, feedback or other matters you give to us by phone, email, post or via social media
- your activities on, and use of, our website
- your professional online presence, eg LinkedIn profile
- information about the services we provide to you
- information about how you use our website and technology systems

You must provide this personal data so that we may provide you with our services unless we tell you that you have a choice.

Sometimes you can choose if you want to give us your personal data and let us use it. Where that is the case we will tell you and give you the choice before you give the personal data to us. We will also tell you whether declining to share that personal data will have any effect on the services that we provide to you.

We collect and use this personal data for the purposes described in the section 'How and why we use your personal data' below.

How your personal data is collected

We collect personal data from you:

- directly, when you enter or send us information, such as when you contact us (including via email), send us feedback, purchase services from, post material to our website and complete customer surveys, and
- indirectly, such as your browsing activity while on our website; we will usually collect information indirectly using the technologies explained in the section on 'Cookies' below

How and why we use your personal data

Under data protection law, we can only use your personal data if we have a proper reason, eg:

- where you have given consent
- to comply with our legal and regulatory obligations
- for the performance of a contract with you or to take steps at your request before entering into a contract, or
- for our legitimate interests or those of a third party

A legitimate interest is when we have a business or commercial reason to use your personal data, so long as this is not overridden by your own rights and interests. We will carry out an assessment when relying on legitimate interests, to balance our interests against your own. You can obtain details of this assessment by contacting us (see '**How to contact us**' below).

How and why we use your personal data—sharing

Marketing

We will use your personal data to send you updates (by email, text message, telephone or post) about our services, including exclusive offers, promotions or new products or services.

We have a legitimate interest in using your personal data for marketing purposes (see above 'How and why we use your personal data'). This means we do not need your consent to send you marketing information. If we change our marketing approach in the future so that consent is needed, we will ask for this separately and clearly.

You have the right to opt out of receiving marketing communications at any time by:

- updating your marketing preferences on our preference centre accessible here [link]

We may ask you to confirm or update your marketing preferences if you ask us to provide further services in the future, or if there are changes in the law, regulation, or the structure of our business.

We will always treat your personal data with the utmost respect and never sell it with other organisations for marketing purposes.

Who we share your personal data with

We routinely share personal data with:

- third parties we use to help deliver our services to you, eg payment service providers, warehouses and delivery companies, sub-contracting platforms such as Freelancer.com and functionality testing solutions such as Wise Software (UK) Ltd
- other third parties we use to help us run our business, eg marketing agencies or website hosts and website analytics providers
- our bank

We only allow those organisations to handle your personal data if we are satisfied they take appropriate measures to protect your personal data.

We or the third parties mentioned above occasionally also share personal data with:

• our and their professional advisors (such as lawyers and other advisors), in which case the recipient of the information will be bound by confidentiality obligations

- law enforcement agencies, courts, tribunals and regulatory bodies to comply with our legal and regulatory obligations
- other parties that have or may acquire control or ownership of our business (and our or their
 professional advisers) in connection with a significant corporate transaction or restructuring,
 including a merger, acquisition, asset sale, initial public offering or in the event of our
 insolvency—usually, information will be anonymised but this may not always be possible. The
 recipient of any of your personal data will be bound by confidentiality obligations

How long your personal data will be kept

We will not keep your personal data for longer than we need it for the purpose for which it is used. For example, we tend to delete any unnecessary data upon termination or expiry of your contract with us.

If you stop using your account we will delete or anonymise your account data after no more than seven years.

Transferring your personal data out of the UK

Countries outside the UK have differing data protection laws, some of which may provide lower levels of protection of privacy.

It is sometimes necessary for us to transfer your personal data to countries outside the UK. In those cases we will comply with applicable UK laws designed to ensure the privacy of your personal data.

We may transfer your personal data to our service providers located outside the UK if, for example, they host your data on our behalf.

Under data protection laws, we can only transfer your personal data to a country outside the UK where:

- the UK government has decided the particular country ensures an adequate level of protection of personal data (known as an 'adequacy regulation') further to Article 45 of the UK GDPR.
- there are appropriate safeguards in place, together with enforceable rights and effective legal remedies for you, or
- a specific exception applies under relevant data protection law

Where we transfer your personal data outside the UK we do so on the basis of an adequacy regulation or (where this is not available) by placing appropriate safeguards in place, together with enforceable rights and effective legal remedies for you. In the event we cannot or choose not to continue to rely on either of those mechanisms at any time we will not transfer your personal data outside the UK unless we can do so on the basis of an alternative mechanism or exception provided by UK data protection law and reflected in an update to this policy.

Any changes to the destinations to which we send personal data or in the transfer mechanisms we rely on to transfer personal data internationally will be notified to you in accordance with the section on 'Changes to this privacy policy' below.

Cookies

A cookie is a small text file which is placed onto your device (eg computer, smartphone or other electronic device) when you use our website. We use cookies on our website. These help us recognise you and your device and store some information about your preferences or past actions.

Your rights

You generally have the following rights, which you can usually exercise free of charge:

We also have procedures in place to deal with any suspected data security breach. We will notify you and any applicable regulator of a suspected data security breach where we are legally required to do so.
